These questions will start by drawing your attention to particular parts of the text and transition to thinking critically about the text, its connection to the rest of Scripture, and its implications for us as God's people. Finally, the study will turn to questions that will encourage us to think directly about how the lessons apply to our lives and how we can come together as a community to support one another in that.
