With G.K. Chesterton's words, evoking the mind of the

haiku poets of old, the author-publisher leaves further description of the content to his reader-reviewers. The man standing in his own kitchen-garden with the fairyland opening at the gate, is the man with large ideas. His mind creates distance; the motor-car stupidly destroys it. (G.K. Chesterton: Heretics 1905)
