- ADAPT WORKSHEET DIFFICULTY ACCORDING TO LEARNERS' PROFICIENCY LEVELS FOR OPTIMAL ENGAGEMENT.

SUCH APPROACHES ENSURE THAT WORKSHEETS FUNCTION AS DYNAMIC LEARNING AIDS RATHER THAN STATIC EXERCISES.
