ACCORDING TO THE U.S. BUREAU OF LABOR STATISTICS, THE EMPLOYMENT OUTLOOK FOR SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGISTS REMAINS STRONG, BUT COMPETITION AND SALARY STRUCTURES DIFFER IN NON-CLINICAL ROLES. PROSPECTIVE CAREER CHANGERS SHOULD WEIGH THE BENEFITS OF BROADER IMPACT AND PERSONAL INTEREST AGAINST POTENTIAL REDUCTIONS IN CLINICAL ENGAGEMENT OR INCOME.

Moreover, the emotional rewards of direct patient contact, often cited as a significant motivator in speech pathology, may be less pronounced in administrative or research roles. It is important to align career choices with individual values and long-term goals.
