(J. Smith, 12 March 2023)

**\*\*Note:\*\*** Since personal interviews are not recoverable by others, MLA suggests including them only as in-text citations.

## **Citing Published Interviews**

Published interviews—those found in books, magazines, journals, websites, or other media—should be cited like any other source, depending on the format.

**\*\*Basic format for a published interview:\*\***

Last Name, First Name of Interviewee. Interview by First Name Last Name of Interviewer. \*Title of the Container\* (e.g., book, magazine), Publisher, Date, URL or DOI (if online).

**\*\*Example:\*\***

Doe, John. Interview by Jane Smith. \*The Literary Review\*, vol. 45, no. 2, 2022, pp. 34-40.

If the interview is found online:

Doe, John. Interview by Jane Smith. \*The Literary Review\*, 15 May 2022, [www.literaryreview.com/interviews/john-doe](http://www.literaryreview.com/interviews/john-doe).

## **Interviews Published as Part of a Larger Work**

Sometimes, interviews are part of a larger collection such as a documentary, book, or website. The citation should include both the interviewee and interviewer, along with the title of the larger work.

**\*\*Example:\*\***

King, Martin Luther Jr. Interview by Stephen Smith. *\*Voices of the Civil Rights Movement\**, edited by Laura Johnson, HarperCollins, 2020, pp. 102-115.

## **Citing an Interview You Found Online (Podcast or Video)**

Online interviews, such as podcasts or video interviews on platforms like YouTube, require similar citation elements with details about the format and URL.

**\*\*Example for a podcast interview:\*\***

Johnson, Emily. Interview by Michael Lee. *\*The Science Hour\**, episode 12, 5 July 2023. Spotify, [open.spotify.com/episode/123abc](https://open.spotify.com/episode/123abc).

**\*\*Example for a YouTube interview:\*\***

Brown, David. Interview by Sarah White. *\*YouTube\**, uploaded by HistoryChannel, 10 Aug. 2023, [www.youtube.com/watch?v=xyz789](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=xyz789).

## **Formatting In-Text Citations for Interviews in MLA 9**

In-text citations for interviews generally include the last name of the person interviewed. If the name appears in the sentence, you may omit it from the parentheses.

When the interview is personal and unpublished, the citation usually looks like this:

(Last Name)

For example:

The experiment's outcomes were "unexpected but enlightening" (Garcia).

If you conducted the interview yourself and want to provide a date for clarity:

(Garcia, 15 April 2023)

When citing published interviews, use the same author-page format as with other sources, if page numbers are available.

- According to Dr. Lee in a recent interview...
- In her conversation with the author, Jane Smith revealed...
